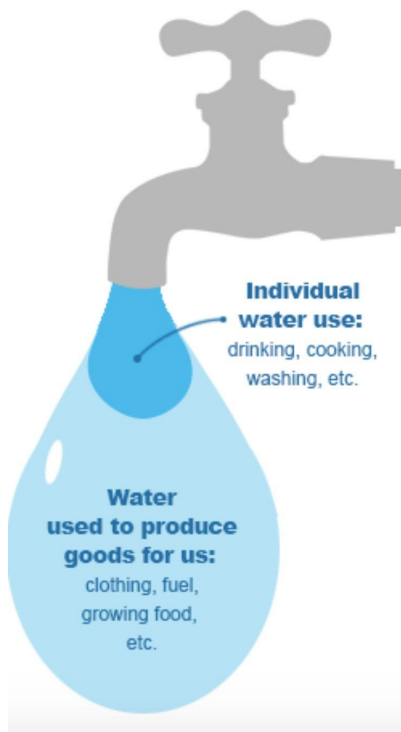

Decrease your water footprint and save money too!

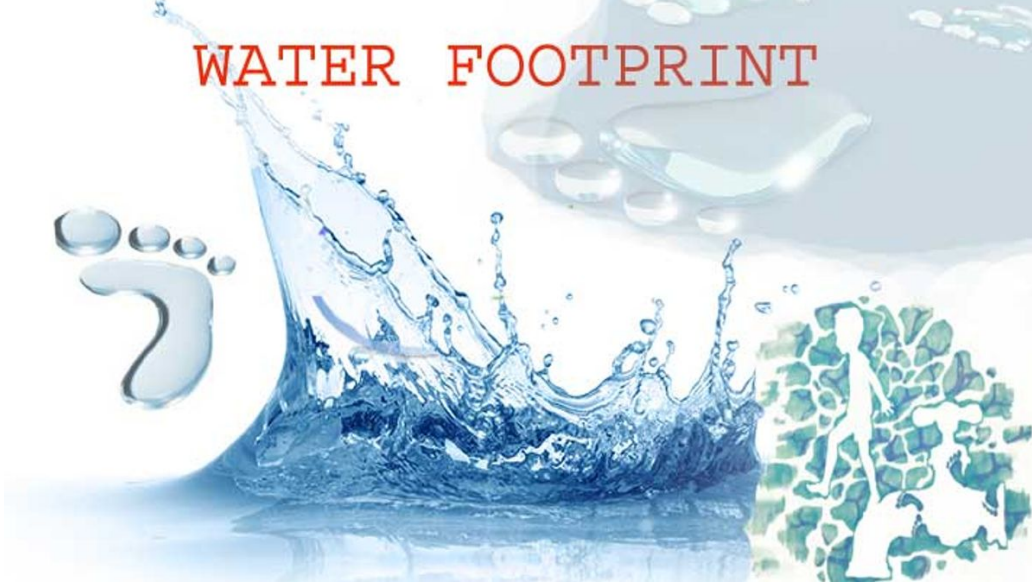

Most of your water use likely comes not from the water that comes out of your tap, but from water used to grow the food you eat and make the things you use. This presentation will discuss water footprints. We will examine where water use by most American's really comes from, and what you can do to save water in your daily life.

Presented by Dr. Afton Clarke-Sather, Associate Professor of Geography at UMD. Afton will talk about water footprints and how our daily choices impact water usage since much of our water use goes to growing the food we eat and making the things we buy.

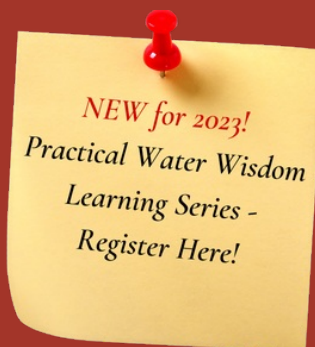
Use a FiveStar Provider!
